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## EXTENSION LECTURES

### ◆ NATIONAL YOUTH DAY

An Extension Lecture was organized by NSS unit of the College on 14th of January, 2021 in which the resource person Mr. Aijaz Abdullah Saraf, ADC Baramulla, delivered his lecture themed "Channelizing Youth Power for Nation Building" to commemorate National Youth Day in the honour of Swami Vivekananda. The National Youth Day was observed with the primary aim of sensitizing the students about the philosophies, principles and ideas of Swami Vivekananda.



### ◆ ESTABLISHMENT OF ROAD SAFETY CLUB

An extension Lecture on Establishment of Road Safety Club was organized by NSS Unit of the college in order to create awareness among the students regarding traffic rules and to reduce casualties of road accidents on 17<sup>th</sup> of January, 2021. The talk was organized by the NSS unit of the college in collaboration with District Administration and Assistant Regional Transport Officer (ARTO) Baramulla.

The ADC presented a brief account of laws governing road use and safety measures and tabled statistics of road accidents and subsequent deaths in J&K and other parts of the country.

## INTRODUCTION OF NEW SUBJECTS

- ◆ Clinical Biochemistry was introduced as a core subject at the undergraduate level in the College from the academic session 2020-21 with the aim to produce manpower having sound technical knowhow in the field of diagnostic health care system. The discipline provides vast theoretical inputs blended with the practical learning, thus, acts as an interface between clinical and non-clinical aspects of Biochemistry. The research fields that the subject encompasses include Molecular Biology, Cancer Biology, Drug Discovery and many more. The laboratory service that the subject offers broadly includes analysis of body fluids, biochemical investigations, tissue and organ profiles that helps in diagnosis, prognosis, treatment, therapy and monitoring of disease. The department has a vision to groom young fertile minds to take clinical research as career option and inculcate scientific temper among students. We strive to provide best facility to our students that ensure them a bright and successful future and help them to serve the society to their best.
- ◆ Islamic Studies was taught in the limited colleges of Kashmir for the past thirty years. However, due to the increase in the interest of students towards this field, this subject was introduced in numerous colleges across the State, including our college from the academic session 2021-22. The efforts taken by the worthy principal, in attaining the speedy affiliation for the said subject from the University of Kashmir, are extremely laudable. This academic program includes the historical study of Islam: Islamic civilization, Islamic history and historiography, Islamic law, Islamic theology, Islamic Sprituality and Islamic philosophy. Specialists in the discipline apply methods adapted from several ancillary fields, ranging from Biblical studies and classical philology to modern history, legal history and sociology. Islamic studies aims at the revival of islamic spirit among the students in order to make them responsible citizens at individual and global level. It inculcates the moral and ethical values of life among the students, in order to eradicate social crimes like Adultery, Theft, Suicide and Drug Addiction. The students are enriched with highest values of life, sense of sustainable development, respect for human beings, beyond the boundaries of race, colour and faith.

**WEBINAR ON CHILD SEXUAL ABUSE (POCSO ACT, 2012)**

The NSS Unit of the College in collaboration with SAKSHI- an NGO organized a Webinar on 10th of June, 2021 to make the NSS volunteers aware about the rights of the children and enable them to strength the youth as powerful enablers for creating a Constitutional Rights Based Environment of Gender equality with a focus on creating awareness about POCSO Act, 2012. Dr. Ramya Nisal, the chief resource person delivered a detailed lecture on POCSO Act of 2012. She also shared SHAKSHI'S videos about the problems faced by the children and the creation of atmosphere in which the children can share their problems without any fear.



**WORKSHOP ON RESEARCH METHODOLOGY IN SOCIAL SCIENCES AND INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS (IPR)**

The First batch of four post-graduate Chemistry students (Sana Zahoor, Asima Jahan, Zeeshan Maqbool, Iffat Majeed) completed three-month Research Internship Programme in the Chemistry Research Laboratory (CRL) of the department from January to March, 2021.



### MANUFACTURE OF SANITIZERS

In view of the COVID-19 pandemic, the Department of Chemistry of the college continued to prepare alcohol-based (Ethanol/Iso-propanol) hand sanitizers as per the WHO recommended protocol to meet the requirement of sanitizers in the college

### RECOGNITION AS CO-GUIDE

Two faculty members of the Department of Chemistry have been recognized as Ph.D. Co-Supervisors; Dr Saleem Farooq at NIMS, Rajasthan and Dr Mushtaq Ahmad Tantray at LPU, Punjab. The formal registration process is in progress.

### ◆ ESTABLISHMENT OF HONEY APIARY

As an initiative to impart skill among the students, the Department of Zoology has established Honey Apiary/bee Hives in the College campus in Collaboration with Department of Apiculture, Government of Jammu and Kashmir in the year, 2021. The collaboration aims to train and impart skill among the students to rear Honey bees for production of Honey.



### ◆ INTRODUCTION OF DAIRY TECHNOLOGY

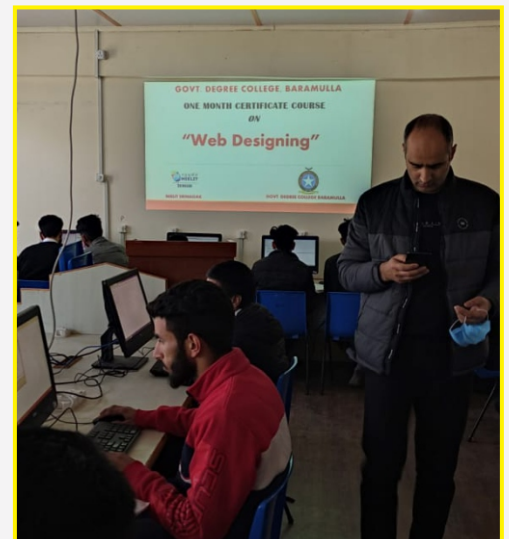


### ❖ SKILLING OF STUDENTS UNDER INDUSTRIAL SKILL DEVELOPMENT INITIATIVE

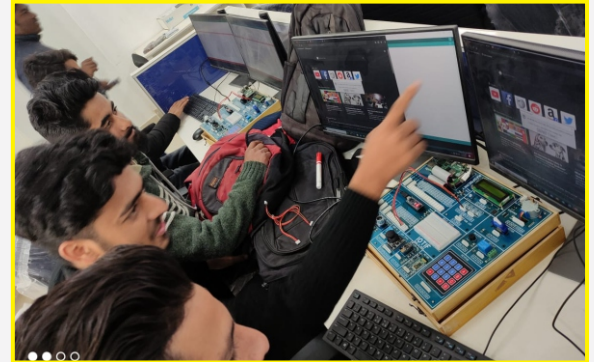




## DEPARTMENTAL ACTIVITIES

Dr Khan spoke about mental issues confronting the young generations in Kashmir. ### INDUSTRIAL VISIT

The Department of Commerce and Management Studies undertook an industrial visit to JK Cable Car Gulmarg on 27<sup>th</sup> of March, 2021, in which at least 14 students of BBA 6th Semester along with a faculty member and a Departmental Assistant participated. Industrial visit being a vital part of the curriculum intended to bridge the gap between classroom and the real working world. The visit provided first-hand knowledge about the organizational structures and modus operandi of Gondola Project of JK Cable Car Corporation. 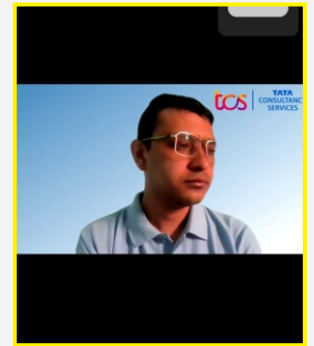
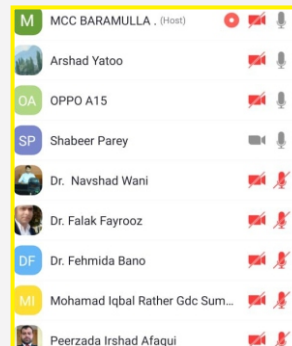
### WEEKLONG PRE-ADMISSION COUNSELLING MELA

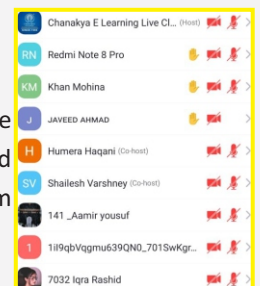


### MoU WITH DISTRICT EMPLOYMENT & COUNSELLING CENTRE

## UPGRADATION OF IT INFRASTRUCTURE

The P. G. Department of Computer Applications played a key role in massive IT-infrastructure Development that took place in the College during last six months. Following initiatives have been taken during the said period.

1. Number of Computers in the campus has been increased to around 350.
2. All lecture theatres/seminar halls/Labs have been equipped with IFPDs/LCD projectors/Interactive flat Panels/Ke-Yans (Multipurpose projection Systems) and A. V solutions. As a step towards gradual switch over to clean and green energy, solar inverters have been installed in almost all the class rooms to ensure uninterrupted power supply to digital teaching aids.
3. Multipurpose campus LAN with fibre based inter-Department connectivity has been established for effective resource sharing.
4. High speed (100mbps) internet connectivity has been established in the College which is being extended to hostels as well.
5. Two internet browsing Centres (Boys & Girls) have been upgraded with latest machines and power backup systems.
6. Intercom and surveillance Systems have been upgraded.
7. Under Hub and Spoke Model, High-end Skill Labs have been established in the Deptt. of Computer Applications and Deptt. of IT



## IQAC ACTIVITIES

### ❖ IQAC ACTIVITIES

In pursuance of its Action Plan for performance evaluation, assessment and accreditation and quality up-gradation of institutions of higher education, the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), Bangalore proposes that every accredited institution should establish an Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) as a quality sustenance measure. Since quality enhancement is a continuous process, the IQAC will become a part of the institutional system and work towards realisation of the goals of quality enhancement and sustenance. The prime task of the IQAC is to develop a system for conscious, consistent and catalytic improvement in the overall performance of institutions. For this, during the post-accreditation period, this college channelized its efforts and measures towards promoting the holistic academic excellence including the peer committee recommendations. The Institutions are requested to submit the AQAR after one year from date of Accreditation every year. A functional Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) and timely submission of Annual Quality Assurance Reports (AQARs) are the Minimum Institutional Requirements (MIR) to



volunteer for second, third or subsequent cycle's accreditation. During the institutional visit, the NAAC peer teams will interact with the IQACs to know the progress, functioning as well as quality sustenance initiatives undertaken by them. The Annual Quality Assurance Report (AQAR) is the part of the Annual Report. The AQAR shall be approved by the statutory bodies of the HEIs (such as Governing Council/ Executive Council/Board of Management) for the follow-up action for necessary quality enhancement measures.

In tune with the guidelines of NAAC Bangalore, the team IQAC of the college worked tirelessly throughout second post Re-accreditation cycle in offline mode and in online mode during COVID-19 pandemic period. With the full support from staff (Teaching and Non-teaching/local fund) the team submitted all AQARs well in time on a devised format. All AQARs were submitted in online mode and were assessed by NAAC, Bangalore. After assessment by expert team of NAAC, the college IQAC team received endorsement letter from NAAC, Bangalore. AQARs of the years 2015-2018 were successfully submitted and endorsed by NAAC team officials. Subsequently college received communication for submission of Institutional Information for Quality Assurance (IIQA)- an online draft document containing entire institutional information along with requisite fee. After successful submission and endorsement, the college received another communication for submission of Self Study Report (SSR).

The NAAC Peer Team Visit (PTV) is scheduled in the months of September, 2021. The entire men and machinery is geared up for assessment and accreditation.

## UPGRADATION OF LABORATORIES

❖ The Department of Biotechnology has been recently upgraded with the installation of modular research benches. Besides, the following latest equipments were procured for the departmental laboratory:

- I. SDS PAGE and Western Blotting Apparatus.
- II. Digital Visible Spectrophotometer.
- III. Microscope with camera.
- IV. Workstation for Bioinformatics work.

❖ A dedicated research lab in the department of Chemistry named as "Chemistry Research Lab (CRL)" with almost all the basic research facilities has been made operational from January, 2021. It has made possible to expand the scale and scope of research in the college by creating a research ecosystem. Among other facilities, the lab has been equipped with High Performance Liquid Chromatography (HPLC) System, the first in the valley colleges. HPLC system has potential analytical applications in many areas of Chemical and Life Sciences.

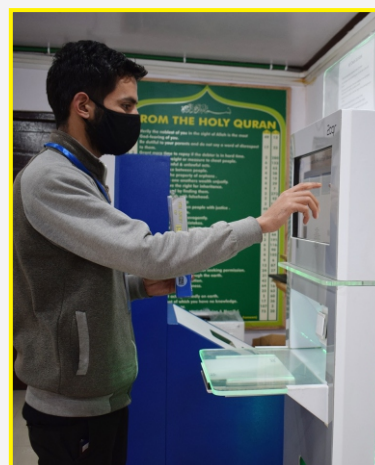


## LIBRARY AUTOMATION

❖ The library of the college is one of the first libraries of J&K, automated in 2013 using SOUL 2.0. The library automation was further enriched through the use of modern KOHA software and RFID technology. This college is among the first colleges of northern India that has enabled RFID technology in library automation. Setting an example, the other colleges of the state started implementing the same technology in their libraries for which special grants were made available. The Important components of RFID technology are:

**Self-Check in/ checkout station:** The station allows patrons to issue/return books without any human interface. The student has to display his RFID chip based card on the system for issue and return of the books.

**Book Drop:** The system allows the patrons to return books just by dropping in the system automatically and receive a printed Receipt.







**LIBRARY AUTOMATION**

**Hand Held Scanner:** The handheld device scans the RFID book tags within minutes thus helps in locating books, shelf rectification and stock control.

**Security Gate:** The RFID gate ensures electronically that no book is issued/taken from the library.

**OPACS (Online Public Access Catalogue):** Students are provided access to the location of books within seconds.

**CCTV Surveillance:** The library is secured through high end CCTV cameras monitoring every nook and corner of the library and its premises.

**E- Resources:** The library has procured e-resources of reputed institutions like IIT's, IIM's and CEC for the students and the faculty.



The library has about 6 TB data of NPTEL and CEC.

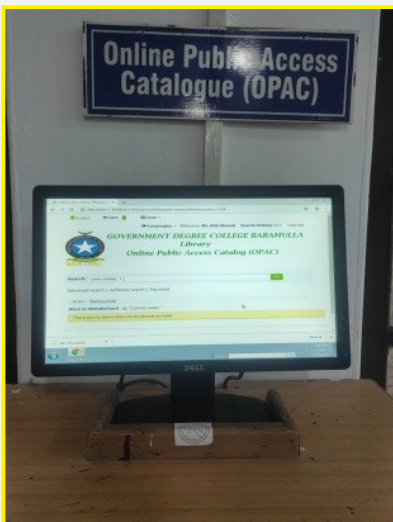
**BROWSING CENTRES:** Two browsing centers, each for boys and girls were upgraded with the latest configuration in all-in-one desktops. 30 new computer systems have been installed in these centres. A high dedicated internet connection of FTTH has been installed for speedy browsing.

**Reference Section:** The furniture of the section was upgraded and new cozy reading chairs are placed for strain free reading of students.

**RFID CARDS :** The library has replaced old PVC cards with the new RFID chip based smart card for self check-in and check-out of library items.

**Subscription to E- Journals and E-Books :** The library subscribes to NLIST which has around millions of e-books and 6000+ journals

**National Digital Library:** The library facilitates registration in national digital library for students and teachers.
