Vaccination drive, third in a row, held at GDC Baramulla

The drive witnessed a satisfactory response and a moderate number of students and staff turned up for getting the shot.

Prof. (Dr.) Mushtaq Ahmad Lone, Principal of the college welcomed a team of healthcare officials deputed by Chief Medical Officer, Baramulla and headed by Mr. Ghulam Rasool Wani, Health Inspector, Medical Block, Sheeri for coming over to render their professional services at our doorsteps. Prof. Lone appreciated the initiative of vaccinating the leftover students and staff before the colleges of UT of Jammu and Kashmir are thrown open for offline business. He also stressed upon the students and staff to observe the COVID-19 appropriate behaviours and advisories shared by local, national, and international healthcare systems.
